



Sub centres offer 12-core package of services

1. Care in Pregnancy and Child Birth
2. Neonatal and Infant Healthcare Services
3. Childhood and adolescent Healthcare Services
4. Family Planning Contraceptive Services and Other Reproductive Healthcare Services
5. Management of Communicable Diseases: National Health Programmes
6. General Out-Patient Care for Acute Simple Illnesses and Minor Ailments



7. Screening, Prevention, Control & Management of Non-Communicable Diseases
8. Care of Common Ophthalmic & ENT Problems
9. Basic Oral Health Care
10. Elderly & Palliative Healthcare Services
11. Emergency Medical Services including Burns & Trauma.
12. Screening & Basic Management of Mental Health Ailments

The Sub-Centres/ PHCs are instrumental in improving healthcare accessibility in mining-affected regions. By offering essential services such as maternal and child health care, immunizations, nutrition counselling and early disease detection, these centres bring vital support closer to the community. They also ensure timely referrals for high-risk pregnancies and emergencies to higher-level health facilities, promoting safe deliveries and reducing the risk of disease outbreaks. Regular health awareness programs foster better hygiene and preventive care practices among residents. Supported by OMBADC funding, the establishment of these health facilities has significantly strengthened local health infrastructure, empowering communities to lead healthier & more secure lives.

Out of the OMBADC completed Sub centres, 10 sub centres have qualified for National Quality Assurance Standards (NQAS) certification

Sub Centre Jambhara, located in Hatadihi block of Keonjhar district, was earlier housed in a rented building with limited facilities. It faced challenges like space constraints and low footfall, limiting healthcare delivery. Now functioning from a dedicated facility, it serves 8,723 people across 10 villages. The upgraded infrastructure has improved accessibility and service quality. Rising footfall reflects growing trust and better health outcomes in the community.

A Health Sub-Centre Pipilia under Ghatgaon block has been established to serve a population of 5,995 across six villages within the catchment area of a Keonjhar district in Odisha.

The Sub-Centre at Jamsara in Bisra block, Sundergarh, earlier operated from a rented building with limited facilities and low footfall. Now upgraded to a dedicated, well-equipped facility, it serves 5,231 people across three villages. Improved infrastructure has enhanced service delivery, community trust, and overall health outcomes.

The Sub-Centre at Badarampas in Hatadihi block, Keonjhar, earlier operated in a rented building with minimal facilities. Now upgraded with dedicated facilities it serves 9,085 people across 08 villages. Improved infrastructure has enhanced footfall, and community trust. Services such as immunization, maternal and child healthcare, and disease prevention are now provided in a safe and organized environment, contributing to improved health outcomes in the region.
